Most girls took 3 A levels and 1 AS level, excluding General Studies. A\* grades are not awarded at AS level, so A is the top grade at AS level.

37.8% of all papers were awarded A\* grades and 82% were awarded A\* or A grades. The percentage of A\* to B grades was 91.7% and 100% of A levels were passed.

At A Level (excluding GS) 2 girls gained 4 A\* grades; 10 girls gained 3 A\* grades; 9 girls gained 2 A\* grades; 22 girls gained 1 A\* grade; and 43 girls gained A\* or A grades in all their subjects.
